### PROTECTING YOUR PROPERTY

The effectiveness of investing in home security has recently been highlighted in Bury St Edmunds in an attempted burglary that has resulted in the arrest of a prolific burglar. The home owner in question had fitted a video enabled door bell. This sent a message to his phone alerting them that someone was at the his door of his house and streamed a video of the person, in this case trying to break in. The police were alerted and on viewing the video footage were able to identify the offender and make an arrest.


### CLOSURE ORDER

Bury SNT have successfully obtained the first Closure Order in the West of Suffolk, using new ASB legislation. The legislation allows us to close a premises in order to protect victims and communities from premises which are causing on going nuisance and disorder. The magistrates ordered this particular premises in Eastgate Street, Bury St Edmunds to be closed for the maximum period of 3 months. This will allow us time to work with our partner agencies to achieve a long term solution to the problem.

### Emergency Service Cadets

Bury St Edmund's Emergency Service Cadets will celebrate their 1st Anniversary this month! We currently have 21 cadet's aged between 13 and 18 in the scheme, which follows a curriculum that combines the skill of both the Police and Fire Service, and promotes the positive attributes of being part of a team, good citizenship, and inspiring them to make a positive impact on the community. The cadets have been involved in various events around the county, supporting activities of the St Nicolas Hospice, The Bury Christmas Fayre to name but a few. The cadets will soon be undertaking a challenge to climb mount Snowdon, and will be raising funds for the St Elizabeth Hospice. Suffolk Police are launching a New Year #CouldYouBeSpecial campaign to attract recruits into the Special Constabulary. Being a member of the Special Constabulary opens up a range of special opportunities; to volunteer, to connect with your community, to get new skills, to extend your personal limits, to reduce harm, to inspire others to join, to make others and yourself proud of what you a difference you can make.
